Eligible voters are defined in our constitution as confirmed members of Faith who have both communed and made a contribution of record to this congregation at least once during the current or preceding calendar year (2020 or 2021). A contribution of record means one to which your name or envelope number is attached. If you put cash in the offering plate without your name or envelope number, that is <u>not</u> considered a contribution of record. This rule (C8.02) is required by the ELCA of all its affiliated congregations.

Eligible voters will receive instructions on how to attend the meeting either by email or postal mail the week prior to May 2. Questions may be directed to the church office by email or phone.

A positive thought: At least, this year perhaps you can plan to safely get together with a few of your family members to celebrate Mother's Day. Please keep in mind, ladies, Mother's Day is for **all** women because most likely **all women** have at some point in their lives "**mothered**" someone who needed that special tender loving care that women know how to give. Have a safe and happy Mother's Day!

In the May issue of ELCA's *Gather* magazine, on page 20 a devotional, rather than the usual Bible study, entitled "The Journey of Generations," has been included which looks at shared blessings that can be developed into inter-generational relationships, which are among God's greatest gifts. The pandemic has interrupted our lives in many ways, but it was **not** able to keep the women of the church from showing the love in their hearts that encourages them to help others in need. The Women of the ELCA have seven marks of discipleship which its members are encouraged to follow: Praying, Studying, Worshiping, Inviting, Encouraging, Serving, and Giving; these marks or characteristics are based upon Matthew 28:19-20 and Acts 1:8. Austin's homeless "problem" has been in the news a lot lately. With numbers seeming to increase daily, the situation can seem overwhelming. However, there is hope.

In a new video available on their website <u>www.mlf.org</u>, titled "Mustard Seed of an Idea Blooms into Home and Community for Homeless Neighbors," Mr. Graham explains that "the single greatest cause to homelessness is a profound catastrophic loss of family." MLF's movement is to transform that loss into community.

Community First! Village was founded in 2005 when they purchased their first slightly used RV and lifted one man off the streets of Austin. Sixteen years later MLF has almost completed Phase 2, which will bring the total number of homes (RVs and micro-homes) to 500+. The Village also includes an outdoor cinema, an art house, concessions and catering, an iron forge, a market, an organic farm, a screen-printing shop, a car care shop, and other opportunities for neighbors to live and work in community.

You can support the village through monetary donations; by purchasing MLF apparel; by purchasing beautiful neighbor-made crafts; through prayer; and by volunteering on the property. You can also arrange for a tour of the property.
