#### From Pastor Tom

Years ago I read and saved an article in *Column* magazine that asked noted Lutheran theologian Martin Marty: "What is the greatest hope for organized religion to thrive, not just survive, in the years ahead?" I shared Pastor Marty's response with my previous congregation and now share it with you. He replied, "A re-involvement with the story of the prophets and Jesus. We must settle neither for individualized self-congratulating spirituality or routinized piety."

Simply stated, in order for the church to thrive, Christian people must be involved in worship and Bible study. No one can force us to make God's word a regular part of our lives. Consequently, churches sometimes leave the impression that worship and Bible study are optional for church members. They are not, if we are to "thrive, not just survive."

Why do so few people attend church regularly? Why are so few involved in Bible study groups and Sunday School? Perhaps we come to be stimulated and entertained and to feel better about ourselves and find that church and Sunday School just don't fulfill our needs. The music does not suit our individual taste; the worship and teachers do not excite us. Perhaps what we really seek is "individualized self-congratulating spirituality." We would prefer to focus on ourselves and what we like and what we can do and how we feel. Lutheran worship which focuses on what God has done in Christ seems irrelevant and out of touch with contemporary religious trends in a society which entertains us better than ever before.

That may sound like a harsh critique, but neither should worship and Bible study be merely "routinized piety." Simply going through the motions and coming to church to participate in routine rituals and recite memorized words doesn't feed our souls any more than do raised hands, tingly goose bumps, and ecstatic tears prompted by state-of-the-art music performers displayed on giant screens by engineers at massive digital sound boards.

The word "liturgy" literally means "the work of the people." Our Sunday morning "work" is intended to prompt "a re-involvement with the story of the prophets and Jesus" so that, by the grace of God and power of the Holy Spirit, God's word becomes meaningful and central in our whole lives. God the Holy Spirit gives us insight for living in relationship with God and one another through involvement in God's word. That's a promise! The Lord assures us through the prophet Isaiah, "My word ...shall not return to me empty, but it shall accomplish that which I purpose, and succeed in the thing for which I sent it." (Isaiah 55:11)

Worship and Bible study. Your life and the life of Faith Lutheran Church will thrive on it. Together, let's pray, invite, and encourage one another to regularly participate in worship and Bible study. The coming holiday season is a great time to do so!

#### 2020 PROPOSED BUDGET

- The council asks that you prayerfully consider the proposed budget for 2020, which is enclosed.
- The income reflects the level of giving to the unified budget in past years as well as an increase in pass -through from the CDC/SYP.
- Expenses include outlay for Call Committee and possible moving expenses for a new pastor.
- The \$100,000.00 budgeted for a senior pastor is the most we feel we can spend for a new pastor. This amount includes salary, social security, 10% pension, and health insurance for pastor and family.
- For the last 7 years we did not pay for health insurance as Pastor Gary was covered by the military.
- Please attend the congregational meeting on December 1, and vote on the budget; see next page for meeting agenda.

#### **Call Committee Update**

The Call Committee has been installed and is meeting regularly, but it's important to understand what a "call" is. From Martin Luther's *The Augsburg Confession* and the ELCA handbook, "certain Christians are specifically called to the ordained ministry of Word and Sacrament," and the call process is "an effort to discern what God wants for the local church and for the whole Church in order that the Gospel may be proclaimed and the sacraments administered in accordance with the Gospel."

The Call Committee is working along the following plan:

- 1) The Call Committee is established and installed...done
- 2) The Call Committee meets with the Office of the Bishop...done
- 3) The Call Committee develops and submits to the Office of the Bishop a Ministry Site Profile...ongoing
- 4) The Office of the Bishop determines potential candidates
- 5) The Call Committee receives names of candidates and begins the interview process
- 6) The Call Committee recommends a candidate to the congregation and sets a congregation meeting date
- 7) The congregation votes to extend a call to the candidate pastor
- 8) The candidate pastor has 30 days to decide on the call

- 1) Find members of the committee at church on Sunday (before/after service, coffee hour, etc.)
- 2) Submit a request in the Call Committee box in the narthex. A request can be either an anonymous recommendation for what traits are important in a potential pastor or a request for a phone call from a committee member.

## Council Highlights from September 23, 2019:



- Committees' budget requests for 2020 have been submitted; the Finance Committee will prepare and present their proposed 2020 budget to the council at its October meeting.
- ◆ The semi-annual congregation meeting to adopt FLC's 2020 budget will be held on December 1, after worship. Other business will include ratification of ELCA constitutional amendments and selection of Synod Assembly representatives.
- Flu shots will be offered to FLC members and staff on October 8; arrangements were made by the Outreach Committee.
- Council approved transferring \$750 from the Accumulated Interest Fund to WELCA for funding bereavement meals.
- FLC raised \$2,105 for Upbring via the golf tournament.


