Congregation Budget Meeting December 5, 11:30 a.m. In person, Activity Center

Faith's December congregation meeting to approve the 2022 budget will be held Sunday, December 5, following worship. The meeting will be held in person in the Activity Center, using social distancing. Masks will be required for anyone who is unvaccinated and encouraged for all.

Eligible voters are defined in our constitution as confirmed members of Faith who have both communed and made a contribution of record to this congregation at least once during the current or preceding calendar year (2020 or 2021). A contribution of record means one to which your name or envelope number is attached. If you put cash in the offering plate without your name or envelope number, that is <u>not</u> considered a contribution of record. Other members of your household may or may not be eligible to participate in the meeting, depending on their own communion and contribution records. Spouses share a contribution record, but confirmed youth and adult children must make contributions under their own name or envelope number to be considered eligible voters. This rule (C8.02) is required by the ELCA of all its affiliated congregations.

In summary: Those confirmed FLC members who wish to speak and vote at any congregation meeting need to commune and make a recorded contribution at least once in the current or preceding calendar year. Deadline to do so for this meeting is November 28.

Hi, ladies:

Thanksgiving has come and gone and, although the coronavirus pandemic is still with us, hopefully you and yours were able to get together to give thanks and celebrate this year. Already decorations are going up, people are shopping for Christmas gifts, and plans are being made for the Christmas holidays when we as Christians gather to celebrate the birth of Jesus. Before you know it, we'll be celebrating the start of a New Year, looking forward with hope for good health and life for all with an end to this pandemic!


Bible Study -- The November/December issue of the Gather magazine includes the last session of the Bible study on "The Gift of the Spirit: A Divine Wild Goose Chase," a study of the Holy Spirit to help us understand the Spirit's action in scripture and our lives, teaching us "Spirit-sighting" skills through studying the Bible. The study, which focuses on how we act and the choices we make, will track down the images of Spirit as wind. In Greek the word for Spirit is "pneuma" (pronounced "nooma") and--like the word ruach for "Spirit" in Hebrew--pneuma means not just Spirit but also wind and breath. The study of "pneuma" is separated into several sections with pertinent scripture verses: A Playful Wind (John 3:1-10), Wind that Refines (Matthew 3:7-12), Wind that Refines Our Fruitfulness (Galatians 5:16-23), Wind that Re-Routes Our Lives (Acts 9:10-19 or the full story Acts 9:1-22), Wind that Re-Routes the Church (Acts 10:25-34, 44-48 or the full story Acts 10:1-48) and the Spirit Who Dwells in Us (Romans 8:14-28, 38-39 or the whole chapter). Geese don't fly alone, their V-formation gives them the command strength to face strong winds giving them endurance and speed. The lead bird is in complete service to the rest but the geese take turns sharing the burden while flying together. Paul wrote in Romans that the Spirit doesn't just accompany us but dwells within us, giving us strength and power to endure hardships and to hold onto hope when things are uncertain. The Spirit will birth new things in and through us. The Spirit is a Reviver, a Reformer, a Refiner, and a Re-Router and stays with us through struggles and joys, hears our groans, and gives us hope and courage. Just as geese don't fly alone, we don't live faith alone and are held together by the love of God.

Christmas for Burnet Road Nursing Home Residents This December -- For the past several years, Faith ladies have helped provide a merrier Christmas with gifts of stuffed animals to hold and cuddle for 13 residents at Burnet Road Nursing Home who seldom receive visitors (about 10 years ago when I first became involved with taking gifts to Burnet Road Nursing Home at Christmas, the Activities Director at that time told me there were usually about 13 residents who seldom had visitors). For this year's Christmas, enough cuddly animals have already been collected and it is my hope you ladies would also be willing to help gather socks for those residents. For those wishing to make sock donations, a box for collecting adult-sized socks will be put in the narthex through the second Sunday in December, after which the gifts would be delivered to the nursing home.

<u>LWR Kits and Quilts</u> -- The packed boxes of Personal Care Kits and School Kits were successfully delivered on Friday, November 5, to the LWR In-Gathering held in Marion, Texas. A total of 31 Mission Quilts, 76 Personal Care Kits, and 182 School Kits were delivered by members of the Outreach Committee. The women of the church greatly appreciate and extend our many thanks for all the support and help received from the Outreach Committee and other members of Faith Lutheran's congregation. Without the help of others who opened their hearts so willingly to help those in need, the Women of the Church would have been unable to have such a successful donation of LWR kits to this year's in-gathering!

May God bless each and everyone one of you and keep you healthy and safe. With the pandemic at Stage 3, hopefully, we soon will be able to gather together safely in the new year. Best Wishes to you all for a very Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.
