

The past months have been difficult for people across the nation and around the world for many reasons. As I write, Covid-19 cases and hospitalizations remain high in our area. The Church grieves and prays for all who suffer even as we long to once again be together with Christian friends. Meeting together right now would not promote the health and "goodwill of all the people." "Let us hold fast to the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who has promised is faithful." We will meet again!

Until we are able to do so in person, I am happy to announce a couple of additional opportunities to stay connected at FLC using technology. Prior to the pandemic, I continued a practice begun by Pastor Gary and met with a group of members every Wednesday at noon for prayer. Beginning on August 5, I will do so again every Wednesday via a Zoom meeting. FLC members who wish to participate may contact Steve and Cathy Zwernemann who will send a link to join either by internet or telephone.

Starting August 9, I will lead a Sunday morning Bible class following online worship. The class will also be a Zoom meeting to which FLC members are invited, 11:15 a.m. – 12:00 noon.

Again, the internet link or phone number may be obtained from Cathy and Steve Zwernemann.

Both of these weekly gatherings will be informal in nature. The prayer meeting will allow time for participants to talk and share prayer concerns, and the Bible class will not be a 45 minute lecture by the pastor! All who attend will be welcome to join in conversation. May God bless our time "together" even while we are apart. God be with you 'til we meet (in person) again!





# Council Highlights from May 25, 2020

- Jacob Dush presented his confirmation questions & answers in advance of his confirmation on May 31.
- The spring congregation meeting has been postponed from June 7 to June 21, and will be conducted electronically. Eligible voters will be provided with prior instructions for joining the meeting either online or by telephone.
- The council retreat scheduled for June 27 has been canceled.
- In-person worship will not resume in June due to continuing concerns over the pandemic.
- The congregation budget is currently showing a surplus due to reduced expenses, but CDC's funds may be depleted in July.

# Council Highlights from June 22, 2020

- Council members do not think a return to in-person worship is safe at this time; we will
  continue to livestream worship and are investigating an audio option using telephones for
  those who are not internet users.
- Pastor Tom's contract with FLC has been renewed through September. He will be on vacation July 24-August 3; we will arrange to have supply pastors on July 26 and August 2.
- The Call Committee is maintaining contact with a primary pastoral candidate and is determining how best to proceed during the pandemic.

CDC has an enrollment of around 30 children including the Summer Youth Program.
 That's approximately half the usual summer enrollment.

On July 2, we began offering "phone-in" church. Through our Zoom account, you can use your **landline telephone or cell phone** to call and **LISTEN** to the live-streamed worship services.

- 1. Dial: **1-346-248-7799** (between 9:50 and 10:00 a.m.)
- 2. You will be asked for the Meeting ID. Enter: 380-097-9062 # (the pound sign)
- 3. You will be asked for the Participant ID. Enter: # (the pound sign)
- 4. You will hear this message: "You are now in the waiting room. You will be admitted soon." Be patient and we will connect you to the service in a few minutes.
- 5. To end the call, simply hang up.

The call-in information/codes above remain the same each week.

Please note: Depending on your phone plan, you could incur long-distance charges as the phone number is not a local 512 number.

# Wednesday Noon Prayer Time AND Sunday Morning Bible Study

Ladies, since we are as yet unable to gather for our monthly Bible studies during our circle meetings, I hope you are continuing to enjoy the monthly Bible study in ELCA's *Gather* magazine. In June's issue, the "Just Love" series, session 1 of the lesson focused on Mary and Martha and the story of their brother Lazarus. The July/August issue includes the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> sessions of "Just Love" and covers scripture verses Exodus 1: 8-22. Session 2 includes the story of the despised tax collector Zacchaeus, and session 3 examines the lesser known story of the midwives Shiphrah and Puah who refused Pharoah's order to kill all Hebrew boys, thus saving the life of Moses. Session 2 widens our understanding of "just love" beyond the family into the community while session 3 considers how "just love" moves us beyond family and community to injustice at a nation's highest levels.

As the coronavirus is still with us, we do not know whether Faith Lutheran will be having their annual bazaar in November; however, all this "stay home" time currently on our hands is a good time for all of us to start working on projects for the bazaar. It's your chance to come up with some creative ideas of your own! If it is decided we are unable to have a bazaar this November, we could perhaps look forward to planning one at a later date. Will keep you posted!

Also, now is the time women of the church usually focus on gathering school supplies for Lutheran World Relief (LWR) School Kits sent around the world to those in need of supplies to further their education. So, please think about picking up some of the following listed items while shopping for your groceries: 70 page spiral notebooks (wide or college-ruled); #2 pencils, (unsharpened); blue or black ballpoint pens (**no gel**); pencil sharpeners; 1-1/2 inch erasers; 24 or 36 count crayons; 12-inch rulers; and scissors (blunt). Of those items, the ones needed most to fill more kits are: **pencil sharpeners, crayons, rulers, and scissors.** You can collect those items in your homes until church is again open for fellowship. Although LWR's In-Gathering of quilts and kits in April was postponed until the fall, no word has been received as to when or if that will happen. Faith's women would need to finish packing their LWR quilts and kits before such in-gathering is scheduled, since the March 27 packing date for LWR quilts and kits had to be canceled. As soon as I learn anything about LWR kits, I will let you know.

Ladies, please remember: If you don't know what to do with yourself, find some material suitable for quilting and cut out 5-1/2 inch or 6-1/2 inch or 9 inch-squares for the women of the church who piece together quilt tops for LWR quilts. Those quilters would love your help cutting squares for them! Also, keep clipping those canceled postage stamps to help cut shipping costs for LWR kits and quilts, leaving a 1/4 inch margin all around each stamp. During this pandemic many people need help supplying food for their families, and your support for the Bread for All Pantry by providing financial assistance, empty egg cartons, and strong shopping bags would be much appreciated. These are just some of the ways you can continue to help others even though you are staying at home!

When it is considered safe for us to gather in groups, I am sure we all look forward to that time when we can again join together in doing "God's Work, Our Hands." Please stay safe, wear your masks, and practice social distancing! If you have any questions related to the women of the church issues, please do not hesitate to give me a call.
